

The History of Upsilon Chi Chapter

Chi Eta Phi Sorority, Incorporated Knoxville, Tennessee

On April 6, 1975, 13 Black Registered Nurses met at the home of Martha Bowden to form a Chi Club for the purpose of applying for a charter chapter of Chi Eta Phi Sorority Incorporated in Knoxville, TN. Chi Eta Phi was an organization of professional registered nurses and nursing students, founded in 1932 with the two-fold purpose of elevating the plane of nursing and increasing interest in the field of nursing. The sorority has chapters throughout the United States, but at that time in the southeast region, only two chapters existed in the state of Tennessee, Alpha Chi in Nashville, and Beta Chi in Memphis.

Five months later, on September 6, 1975, twenty nurses were initiated into the newly chartered Upsilon Chi Chapter at the home of Dr. E.V. Davidson. Initiation and installation of new officers and members was done under the guidance of Verdelle Bellamy (Gamma Chi Chapter) Supreme Basileus, Edna Batiste (Lambda Chi Chapter) National Organizer, and Ella Williams (Lambda Chapter) Southeast Regional Director. New members and officers were:

**Soror Virginia McClain was initiated two weeks later, as she went into labor and delivered a baby girl, Treasure McClain, on September 6, 1975.

Of special note, during the 1975-1976 year, Soror Edna Mayfield was named a delegate to the American Nurses Association's Convention that was held in Atlantic City, New Jersey. Soror Esther Davidson was elected president of the auxiliary program at The University of Tennessee Medical Center and Soror Katie Haynes retired after 35 years of nursing with the Public Health Department.

Upsilon Chi initiated two new sorors, Lois Johnson and Deborah Fowler on March 19, 1977, with special guests present, the Southeast Regional Director Soror Ella Williams and sorors from Lambda of Asheville, North Carolina. During this year, Upsilon Chi presented their first scholarship to Frances McGinnis (\$500), a nursing student at The University of Tennessee, Knoxville. The chapter also, in conjunction with Jack and Jill and the East Tennessee Heart Association, sponsored blood pressure clinics at several area churches. Upsilon Chi offered tutoring sessions for LPNs preparing to challenge exams or desiring reviews. Also, during that year, Soror Edna Mayfield was nominated for Nurse of the Year sponsored by the District 2 Tennessee Nurses Association.

Upsilon Chi Chapter hosted the 28th Southeast Regional Conference in April 1981 at the Sheraton West Hotel.

The charter members currently living are Sorors Darneta G. Brown, Gloria Lane, Virginia McClain, Mattie W. Ragland, Aleece Stewart, Mary Allis Walker, and Cynthia White.

The current active membership is 31.





Rukiya S. Foster is a native of New Brunswick, New Jersey. She graduated from Bishop George Ahr/St. Thomas Aquinas High School in Edison, New Jersey. She continued her education at the University of Tennessee-Knoxville and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Spanish and a Master of Science in Secondary Education.

In 2000, she began her career in education with Knox County Schools as a World Language Educator (Spanish). During her 17 years as an exemplary educator, she has held various leadership positions, such as a TAP (System for Teacher and Student Advancement) Mentor Teacher, World Language Department Chair, and was named twice as Teacher of the Year.

While growing up, Rukiya witnessed her parents' love and service to others through their professions as a Dean at Rutgers University (father) and a Litigation Attorney for many notable organizations (mother). Like her parents, she was excited to help and serve others as an educator. In addition, she aimed to provide her students with the same opportunities and meaningful experiences that had impacted her during childhood. Rukiya also understood that the opportunity to shape, encourage, and influence students' lives and be a part of their personal and professional achievements would be a tremendously rewarding experience.

As a firm believer that applied knowledge is power, armed with her faith and inspired by her love for traveling, in 2016, Rukiya created the Austin-East Spanish Travel Club, which provided the opportunity for students to experience Europe in person. As a result, she was selected to be a member of the prestigious Knox County Schools Leadership Academy for the 2017-2018 school year as an Assistant Principal/ Leadership Academy Fellow at Powell High School. Upon completing the program, Rukiya graduated with an Education Specialist Degree in Educational Leadership from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, TN, in 2018.

Currently, she is the A.S.C.E.N.D. Freshman Academy Principal at Austin-East Magnet High School, and impacts her community and students daily through education and service. Her goal is to inspire, uplift, and cultivate the passions and talents of all students.

Her student-first approach, reputation as a dynamic leader, collaborator, innovative thinker, love for her school community, and those she serves led her to be selected as the 2025 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Education Leadership Award Recipient.

Furthermore, as the A.S.C.E.N.D. principal, she has implemented strategic planning, analyzed solutions, and created programs to encourage and increase student achievement. Rukiya has also led the creation of many events and programs that provide her students with the skills necessary to become successful, lifelong learners.

Rukiya is committed to following in the footsteps of those who inspired her and striving to live a life characterized by honesty, integrity, and responsibility. She firmly believes, "The function of education is to teach one to think intensively and to think critically. Intelligence plus character — that is the goal of true education."
